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Hayes Receives Community Scholarship Award



Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) member Shirley R. Hayes, RN, MSN, AOCN®, received the Community Scholarship Award at the Joan Ashley Fiffick Memorial Lectureship, which was held in

Akron, OH, on April 16. This award honors outstanding oncology nurses for their contributions to the field of cancer care and provides additional educational experiences. Hayes is a clinical nurse specialist and coordinator of pain and symptom management services for Hospice and Palliative Care of Visiting Nurse Service in Akron.

Hayes demonstrates her expertise daily by helping patients with cancer and their families with treatment issues. Her articles on pain management and cancer have been published in the *Akron Beacon Journal*, *The Bulletin of the Summit County Medical Society*, and *Northeast Ohio Oncology Nurses News*. Since 1984, she frequently has addressed clinical audiences locally and nationally on a range of pain-related topics.

Hayes' distinguished career includes teaching positions in the Western Pennsylvania School of Nursing in Pittsburgh and the Timken Mercy School of Practical Nursing in Canton, OH; staff development with Aultman Hospital in Canton; and serving as a clinical nurse specialist with the practice of Sandra Hazra, MD, in Akron. Hayes earned her master's degree in nursing from the University of Akron and her bachelor's degree from the University of Cincinnati.
